



Position – Secondment in Home Economics Education
(12-month)

The Department of Curriculum and Pedagogy (EDCP) and the Teacher Education Office at the University of British Columbia invite applications from experienced teacher educators with expertise in Home Economics Education for a twelve-month seconded teacher position commencing in September, 2013.

Candidates must have a masters degree in education, and at least 5 years of teaching in a school setting, and experience acting as school advisor for teacher candidates. The successful candidate should have a strong background in teaching Home Economics Education. The successful candidate should also be able to provide leadership in the undergraduate program. Responsibilities will include teaching in the teacher education program, and the diploma and certificate programs in Home Economics Education. The position will also include supervision of teacher candidates, and some administrative duties involving the Home Economics Education program. UBC provides orientation, mentoring and support for instructors who are new to teaching at the university level.
